

TO SEE BOB DYLAN PLAY in a small club isn't that what every Dylan fan dreams about? The dream was indeed coming true at least for 600 of his fans in Stockholm when a warmup gig was announced to take place the day before the actual start of the European tour at the Globe Arena in Stockholm. The venue chosen for the warm-up concert was Debaser Medis. a very popular rock club. Minutes after the concert was announced fans started gathering outside the ticket office and a day and a half later the lucky few had secured tickets for this once-in-a-lifetime show.

The atmosphere in the club was electric when Bob Dylan and his band entered the stage and you could almost feel a unison gasp from the crowd when Bob reaches for his electric guitar and straps it on. It seems like ages ago he abandoned the guitar in lieu of keyboards, so it's nice to see him centre stage with a guitar again.

The audience is ready to make this evening into something very special and an ovation greets the opening

chords of the first song, "Most Likely You Go Your Way And I'll Go Mine". It's followed by "Not Dark Yet" which is given the slow and majestic treatment the song requires. It's a lovely performance which goes down well with the excited crowd.

Dylan seems focused from the very start of the show and it's fascinating to see the band close up; they keep their eyes on Dylan all the time, looking out for those little signals with which he conducts the band. Dylan's singing is great and he bends his knees and sways to the music. In short, he seems to be enjoying himself.

The concert continues with solid versions of "I'll Be Your Baby Tonight", "It's Alright, Ma (I'm Only Bleeding)", a slightly re-written "Tears Of Rage" and "Highway 61 Revisited". The latter is heavy stuff which could knock your brains out. However, things calm down with the next song: a nice and mellow version of "Lay, Lady, Lay", which is well received by the audience.

After seven songs Dylan switches to keyboards and the band kicks into a boisterous version of "Rollin' And Tumblin", the first of two songs from "Modern Times" played tonight. This is a real rocker and the audience goes wild. Dylan decides to slow things down with a soft and tasteful rendition of "To Ramona". Again the audience explodes in cheers as he reaches for his harmonica for the first and only time this evening.

"Country Pie" gets the usual "country swing" treatment and is nice enough although it's hardly one of Bob's best songs. The opposite goes for the next two songs, which in turn is the epic "Tangled Up In Blue" and the classic "A Hard Rain's A-Gonna Fall". The latter is done exceptionally well and is one of the highlights of the concert. Bass player Tony Garnier who's been in Dylan's band for 18 years now, switches to acoustic bass for the rockabilly number "Summer Days", which is the final song. Bob Dylan leaves the stage to the sound of thunderous applause, cheers,

whistling and stomping during which the entire building must have been close to collapsing.

Dylan and the band return for three encores, the first one is one of the greatest songs of all times, "Like A Rolling Stone". The song is usually a real crowd pleaser and tonight is no exception. This is followed by a thundering "Thunder On The Mountain" and "All Along The Watchtower". Dylan gives us wave with his hat and strolls off stage accompanied by deafening applause.

Was this a classic concert moment? Well, it certainly will be mentioned among those classic concerts in Stockholm, e.g. Bruce Springsteen in 1975 and Bob Marley in 1980 etc. The overall impression is that this was a solid performance, maybe even a great one and there is no doubt that it will be talked about for a long time by the lucky 600 who were there to witness this "open rehearsal". After all, to see Bob Dylan play in a small club isn't that what every Dylan fan dreams about?
